

GOVERNOR'S CUP

Governor's Circle Award Prerequisite

• From among those clubs who are selected as Governor's Circle Award recipients, a club that demonstrates an outstanding level of achievement will be selected to receive the Governor's Cup. Such recognition will be reserved for a club judged to have achieved truly exceptional results during the year. Clubs may (but are not required to) submit an impact statement of 500 words or less describing their achievements during the Rotary year, which will be considered in conjunction with Rotary Citation materials and other information from input of Assistant Governors, Committee Chairs and other sources.

Benefactors Award

This award will be presented to the Rotary clubs that have increased their percentage of Benefactors between July 1, 2019 and June 15, 2020. Results will be determined by the Executive Secretary and District Secretary.

Statistical Awards

The statistics will automatically be compiled by the District Secretary at the end of the Rotary Year for the following awards:

- Net Membership Growth Tier Awards Apply
- Most Improved Attendance Tier Awards Apply
- Best Attendance Tier Awards Apply

Rotary Foundation Awards Awards will be presented to the top three clubs in both per capita giving and gross contributions to the Annual Fund of the Rotary Foundation. Special awards may be given to recognize participation and support for the Rotary Foundation.

Other Awards

Rotary International awards, such as the Rotary Citation, Rotary International Public Image Award, Significant Achievement Award, etc. will be awarded based upon compliance with the criteria established by Rotary International for such awards.
